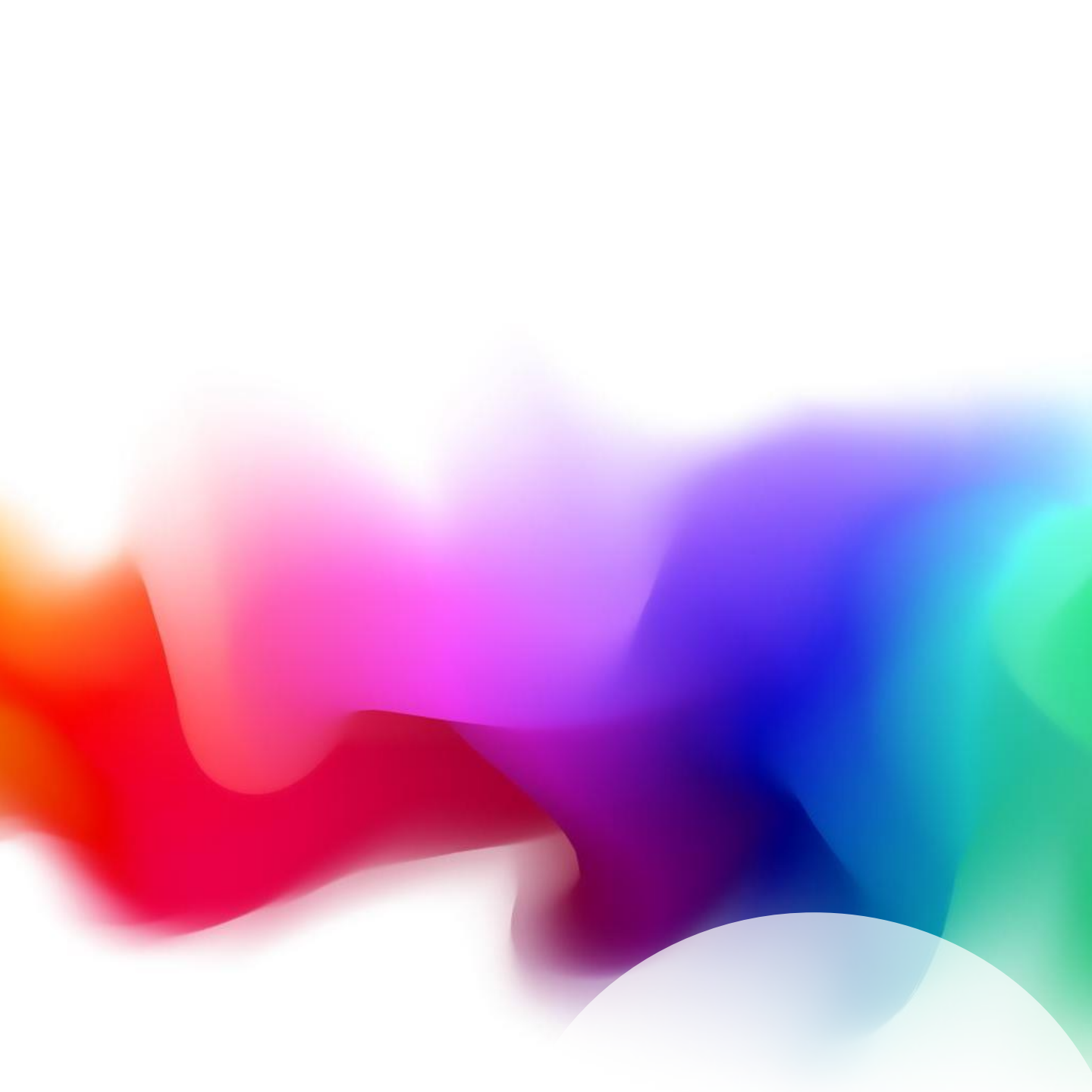
- **Conditions of Sale**

This colorful stone has multiple shades of deep color. The peak movement from left to right is excellent. (Stone has a cut bottom)

This stone has amazing texture. If you look closely, you can see the face of a bear on the right or at another angle it is a craggy mountain cliff. Stone was collected from the Snowy Range, Wyoming in 2009. Snowy Range stones are unique as they are under heavy snow cover for 9 to 10 months a year.

This stone is a unique find in the United States.

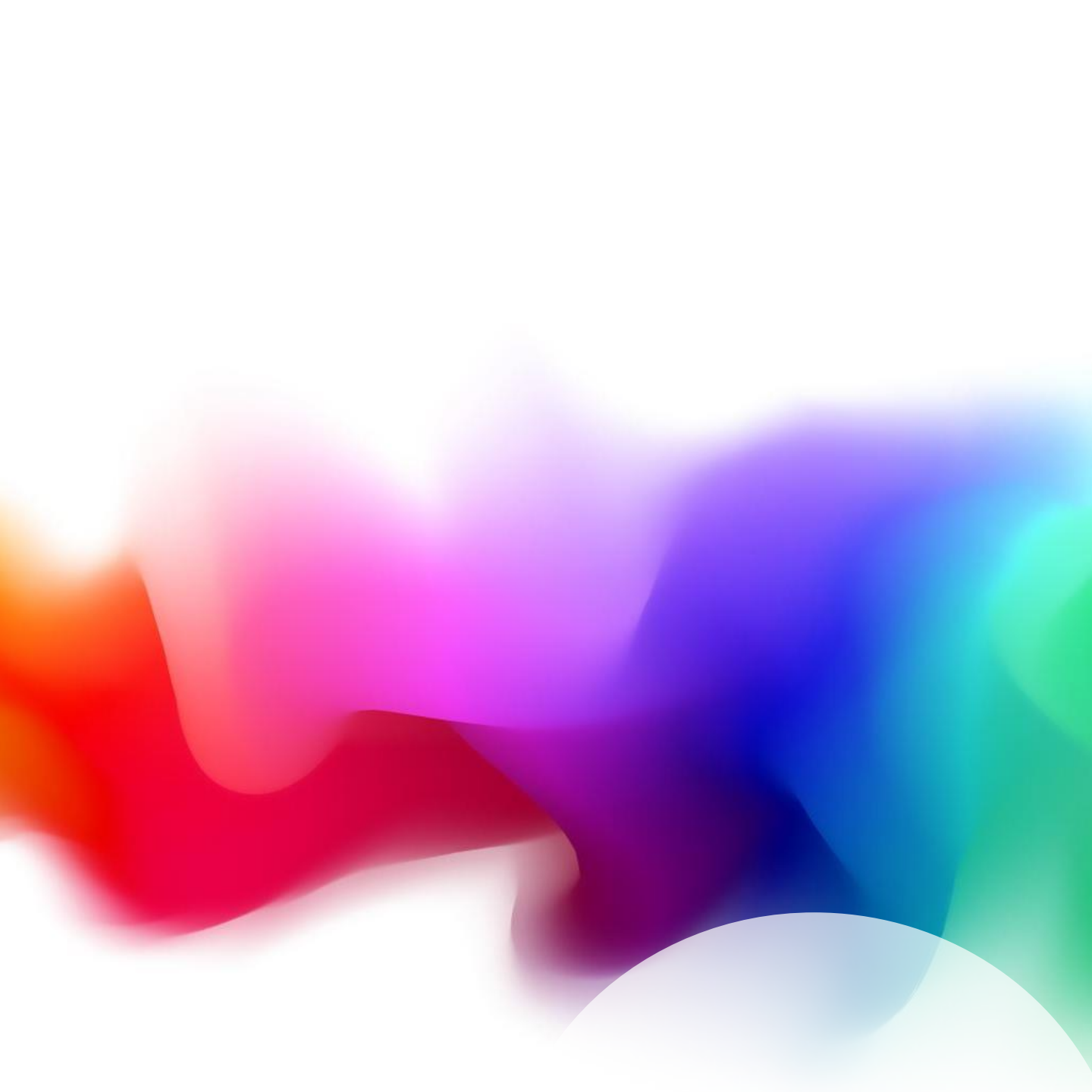
